#### **TRIP REPORT**

## 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2023: Transfer from Madrid

Martin met Julie, Peter and Paul at Terminal One of Madrid airport off their Manchester flight which had arrived punctually. Quite quickly we were on the southern ring-road and then out on the motorway to Extremadura. At dusk we could see the silhouettes of **White Storks** on their nests as we approached the halfway point of our journey. We reached Casa Rural El Recuerdo at about 23.30.

## 23<sup>rd</sup> April 2023: Madrigalejo area, Campo Lugar plains and Alcollarín Reservoir

It was a warm sunny day, with a pleasant light breeze most of the day. We took the road south, past Zorita and onto the edge of the rice fields near Madrigalejo. On the way we saw two **Black-bellied Sandgrouse** in flight and several **Black Kites**. We had a very productive morning along a road, with fruit orchards on one side and rough pasture with scattered trees on the other. Here we saw three **Black-winged Kites**, gorgeous small raptors, including an adult and two juvenile birds. There were **Iberian Grey Shrikes** and **Bee-eaters**. At an old gravel pit we had good views of **Purple Heron**. A **Black Vulture** was being mobbed by a **Buzzard**, which was completely dwarfed, gave us a stunning sensation of the size of the vulture.

On the nearby plains we had excellent views of **Calandra**, **Greater Short-toed**, **Thekla** and **Crested Lark**, along with several **Northern Wheatears**. A chase between a **Calandra** and **Greater Short-toed** again offered us a great size comparison. Further along, we watched two **Rollers** and a **Lesser Kestrel**.



After coffee, we moved to the Alcollarín Reservoir, pausing first to watch **Bee-eaters** beside their colony, for our picnic and to spend the rest of the day. In the picnic area we had great views of **Purple Heron**, **Spoonbill** and **Kingfisher**. Nearby we watched a singing **Great Reed Warbler** and **Melodious Warbler**. We found a summer plumaged **Spotted Redshank** and a range of interesting butterflies included **Black-eyed Blue**. Along the western shore, was a

wonderful flock of **Collared Pratincoles**, courtship-feeding **Gull-billed Terns** and an interesting range of waders, including **Ruff** (including males in summer plumage undertaking a courtship dance with females) and **Little Stint**, a **Black-necked Grebe** and a few duck. **Quail** called from the rough grassland around us.



24<sup>th</sup> April 2023: River Guadiana at Valverde de Mérida, Alange Reservoir, River Guadiana at Don Benito

A warm sunny day and we headed south to the River Guadiana. Our first stop was near Valverde de Mérida where as soon as we got out of the car we were rewarded with an excellent view of a male **Golden Oriole**. We heard and saw briefly a **Western Olivaceous Warbler**. Very impressive was the large **House Martin** colony under the bridge, along with **Alpine** and **Pallid Swifts**. From there it was just a short drive to the dam of the Alange Reservoir. We enjoyed a lovely walk here, accompanied again by **Alpine Swifts**. The treat was a pair of **Black Wheatear**, which we watched at length. There was a good supporting cast of birds including **Blue Rock Thrush**, **Thekla Lark** and **Iberian Grey Shrike**.

We had a coffee at a nearby bar and then returned to the dam to sit in the shade and have our picnic. From there we drove through Alange and visited the north-eastern shore of the Alange Reservoir. Here there were several **Gull-billed Terns**, **Collared Pratincoles** and a selection of waders including some beautiful **Kentish Plovers**, two summer plumaged **Sanderling** and some **Little Stints**.

It was getting hot, so we drove to the Guadiana River near Don Benito where we walked in partial shade beside an old gravel pit. A **Western Olivaceous Warbler** was heard, not seen, but we did see **Red Avadavat**, lots of **Iberian Magpies** and a charming **Tree Sparrow**.

### 25th April 2023: Monfragüe National Park

We drove north, across the vast undulating *dehesas*, crossing the Tagus River and then entering the Monfragüe National Park beside the Tiétar River, at the Portilla del Téitar. Here rocky crags emerged from wooded hillsides, a place for nesting **Griffon Vultures** and also a nest of **Eagle Owls**, on which we saw, eventually, two chicks. Often they lay low, hidden, but sometimes, they would rise and peer across the valley. Beautiful. We also had superb views of two **Black Storks** soaring above us, often interacting with **Black Kites** or **Egyptian Vultures**. **Black Vultures** settled on the crags amongst the **Griffons**. A **Spanish Imperial Eagle** gave us an excellent show, soaring over our heads.



We stopped to have coffee in a small hotel set amongst cork oak trees. Following coffee we made our way southward through the park, making several stops at the well-appointed viewpoints. At all we saw **Black** and **Griffon Vultures**.

We completed out visit to Monfragüe with a stop at the famous viewpoint of Salto del Gitano, looking across at the Peña Falcón cliff. Here we watched a **Black Stork** sitting on its nest, **Griffon Vultures** and a **Booted Eagle** soaring overhead, **Peregrine Falcon** and **Raven**, and closer at hand **Blue Rock Thrush**, **Rock Bunting**, **Black Redstart**, **Red-rumped Swallows** and **Crag Martins**. A **Large Psammodromus** lizard emerged from the shadows.



26th April 2023: Free Day: Pago de San Clemente and Trujillo

Julie, Peter and Paul spent the morning on a gentle walk from Casa Rural El Recuerdo, with sightings including **Booted Eagle**, **Nightingales** and **Hoopoe**. This was followed by a visit to Trujillo and Martin met them in the afternoon as they were watching **Lesser Kestrels** at the Bull Ring. Before returning to base, we stopped to watch a roosting **Scops Owl** at close range in a small town park.



### 27<sup>th</sup> April 2023: Plains near Santa Marta de Magasca and River Almonte

We had an earlier start to make the best of the morning on what promised to be a very hot day. The morning on the plains east of Santa Marta de Magasca was superb, good light with some cloud cover. We found very quickly a **Great Bustard** and saw by the time we left a further eight birds. A displaying **Little Bustard** was more than sufficient reward for the early start. We had several sightings of **Pin-tailed Sandgrouse** in flight, a **Montagu's Harrier**, an adult **Spanish Imperial Eagle** and larks galore. A **Whinchat** was also a nice find. To the south of the village we explored the plains further, seeing perhaps ten **Rollers**, as well as **Little Owl** and a fine male **Montagu's Harrier**. A further four more **Great Bustards** were seen.

After coffee in Santa Marta de Magasca we stopped beside the River Magasca. Here there was a pair of **Cirl Bunting**, **Crag** and House Martins. We then headed to the River Almonme where we had our picnic. A **Grey Wagtail** was watched several times, but it was the sky which drew our attention with a pair of **Short-toed Eagles**, a juvenile **Spanish Imperial Eagle** and all three **vulture** species.

The afternoon was getting exceptionally hot for the time of year. Reaching the mid-thirties, so given the early start, and early return to base was quite in order. The evening outing for night birds yielded again the sound of **Red-necked Nightjars**, but also **Little Owl** and a high-flying **Tawny Owl**.

#### 28th April 2023: Arroyo de la Vid and Arrocampo Reservoir and return to Madrid

We bade farewell to Casa Rural El Recuerdo shortly before 09.00 and made a stop in Trujillo to watch **Pallid Swifts**. Onward then to the beautiful cork oak groves near the Arroyo de la Vid. Here we were surrounded by birdsong: **Nightingales**, **Spanish Sparrows**, **Cetti's Warblers**, **Melodious Warbler** (later seen singing atop a tree) and **Western Orphean Warbler**. We had superb views of a Western Subalpine Warbler, and shorter glimpses of the **Western Orphean**. A **Turtle Dove** purred in the background whilst the wonderful song of **Woodlark** was also heard. Just before we left there was a magnificent fly past of **Griffon** and **Black Vultures**.

We then moved onto the Arrocampo Reservoir near the town of Saucedilla. There overlooking a reedbed, we watched a **Squacco Heron** fly over as we arrived and then during our stay, lovely sightings of **Western Swamphen** with chicks, **Savi's Warblers**, **Reed Warblers**, **Gull-billed Terns** and two **Whiskered Terns**. **Purple Herons** arrived and perched in the reedbeds in front of us. Sadly the time arrived for us to move on. We repaired to the town for a coffeebreak and then started our return to Madrid, in the opposite direction to a massive movement from the city at the start of the May bank holiday. We stopped halfway for lunch and then arrived at 15.00 on the dot at Terminal One.
